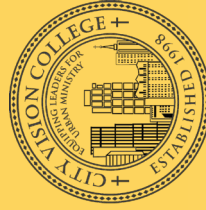

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

City Vision College operates on an accelerated semester basis with five terms each year beginning in August, October, January, March, and June. Students may take courses in any of the following ways:

1. ENROLLMENT IN INDIVIDUAL COURSES

Anyone who is a high school graduate may enroll in City Vision College courses. It should be kept in mind that these are upper division undergraduate courses. If the student wishes to pursue a certificate or degree after taking individual courses, all credits earned will be applied to that program. City Vision College courses may be used for continuing education credits toward the Certified Fund Raising Executive and NAADAC addiction counselor credentials.

2. DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAMS

City Vision College offers a degree completion program leading to a Bachelor of Arts in Missions with an urban ministry emphasis or a Bachelor of Science in Addiction studies.

Missions Program: prepares students to lead and to work in Christian social service ministries, primarily those in urban settings. This program provides a Bachelor of Arts in Missions where students may choose from either a focus on Ministry or Nonprofit Management.

Addiction Studies Program: equips Christian workers to work effectively with alcoholics, drug addicts and their family members. It also provides training to prepare for the addiction counselor certification process in the states in which they reside. These courses also can be taken for continuing education credits for those already holding certification. This degree requires 120 credits and is equivalent to the 4-year academic degree awarded by accredited residential colleges in the United States. To earn this degree, the student must have additional transfer credit hours from an accredited college or university in addition to any courses taken from City Vision College. A maximum of 90 credit hours from outside institutions may be transferred with students required to take at least 30 credit hours - the equivalent of the senior year - to earn a degree from City Vision College.

3. CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

The Certificate in Missions and the Certificate in Addiction Studies are granted to students who successfully complete 30 hours of City Vision College course work in an area of specialization. Since each course is worth 3 credits, students must take 10 courses to receive this certificate.

COST

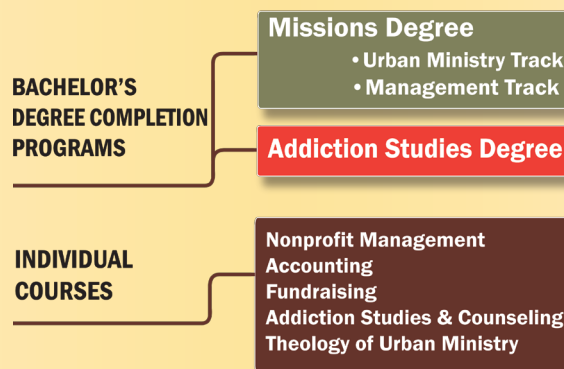
All courses are \$150/credit hour = \$450/course (25% discount for AGRM members). There are additional costs for course materials. Courses are 8 weeks and take about 10-15 hours of study time per week.

FINANCIAL AID

We have applied to be certified so that students who qualify for financial aid may apply their Pell Grants to pay for City Vision College in 2009 (pending approval). Some scholarships may be available for specific classes or partner institutions. City Vision College is also approved for educational assistance benefits for qualified veterans and their dependants under programs administered by the US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). Please call for assistance in applying for financial aid.

TRANSFER CREDIT

City Vision College credits may be transferred to any member of the Higher Education Transfer Alliance which includes hundreds of colleges and universities as well as most schools that are accredited by the Association for Biblical Higher Education. In addition, City Vision College accepts transfer credits from any institution recognized by the US Department of Education or the International Handbook of Universities.
